

Free St. Luke's Literary Society

Overview

Members of this society were most likely part of the congregation of St. Luke's Free Church, which at this time was installed in a new church built for them on Great Hamilton Street (now London Road, SE) in Glasgow's East End. There is little currently known about this society. The information we have comes from the Glasgow Post Office Directory for 1853-1854, which lists the society's representatives in the Glasgow Free Church Literary Union (see below).
